




Addressing a Global Crisis





Content translated and adapted

- identifying learning outcomes are transferable and relevant to the regional context
- analyzing the participant background to adjust curriculum workload
- customizing the materials to address specific challenges related to VAW in the central-asian region
- modifying the course structure: adjust layout, sequencing, and pacing
- determining which technology is relevant to the new platform capabilities and which need to be replaced
- working with professional interpreters and subject matter experts
- collaborating with local stakeholders and experts
