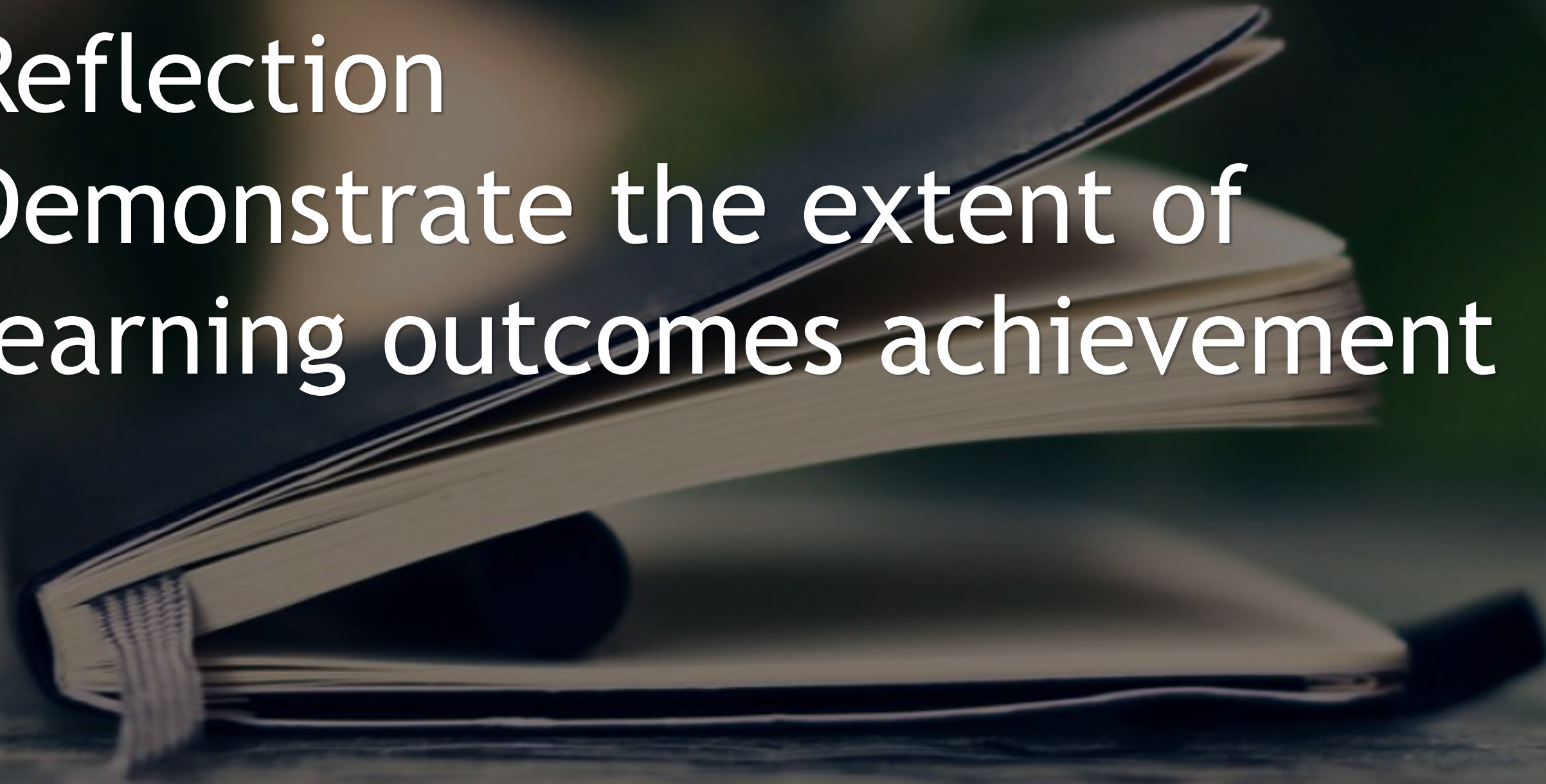

Purpose (Process)

Through reflection:

- Self-assessment
- Ownership of learning
- Student-centered activity
- Lifelong learning

Purpose (Beyond the process)

Tool for:

- Personal development
- Learning record
- Direction for career planning
- Feedback (peers & instructors)
- Showcase for employment

Criteria for Assessment

Holistic & Rubric

- Quality of individual pieces
- Evidence from students' work for support (visuals multimedia)
- Depth of self-reflection

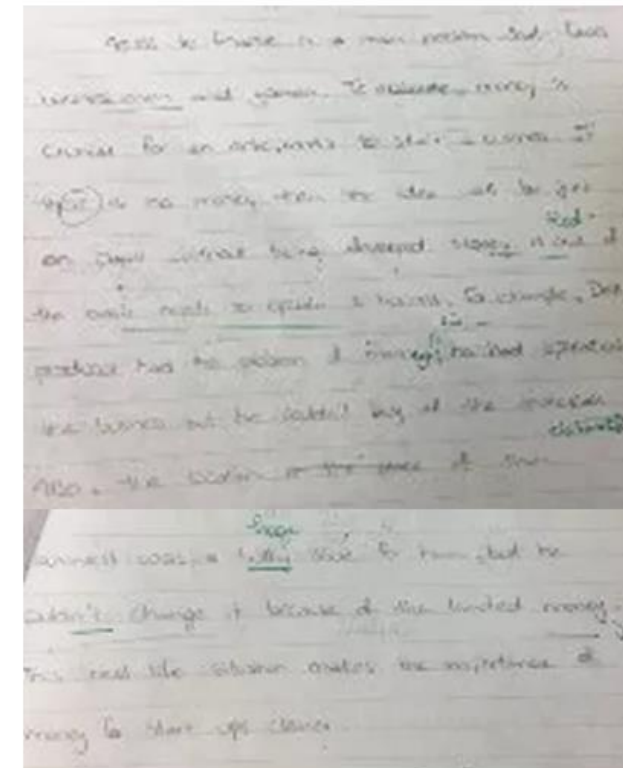
Objective 2

Prompt: "Many young businessmen and women face challenges that make them unable to complete their work. Discuss two main challenges that might affect the success of any business, and explain why these are challenges."

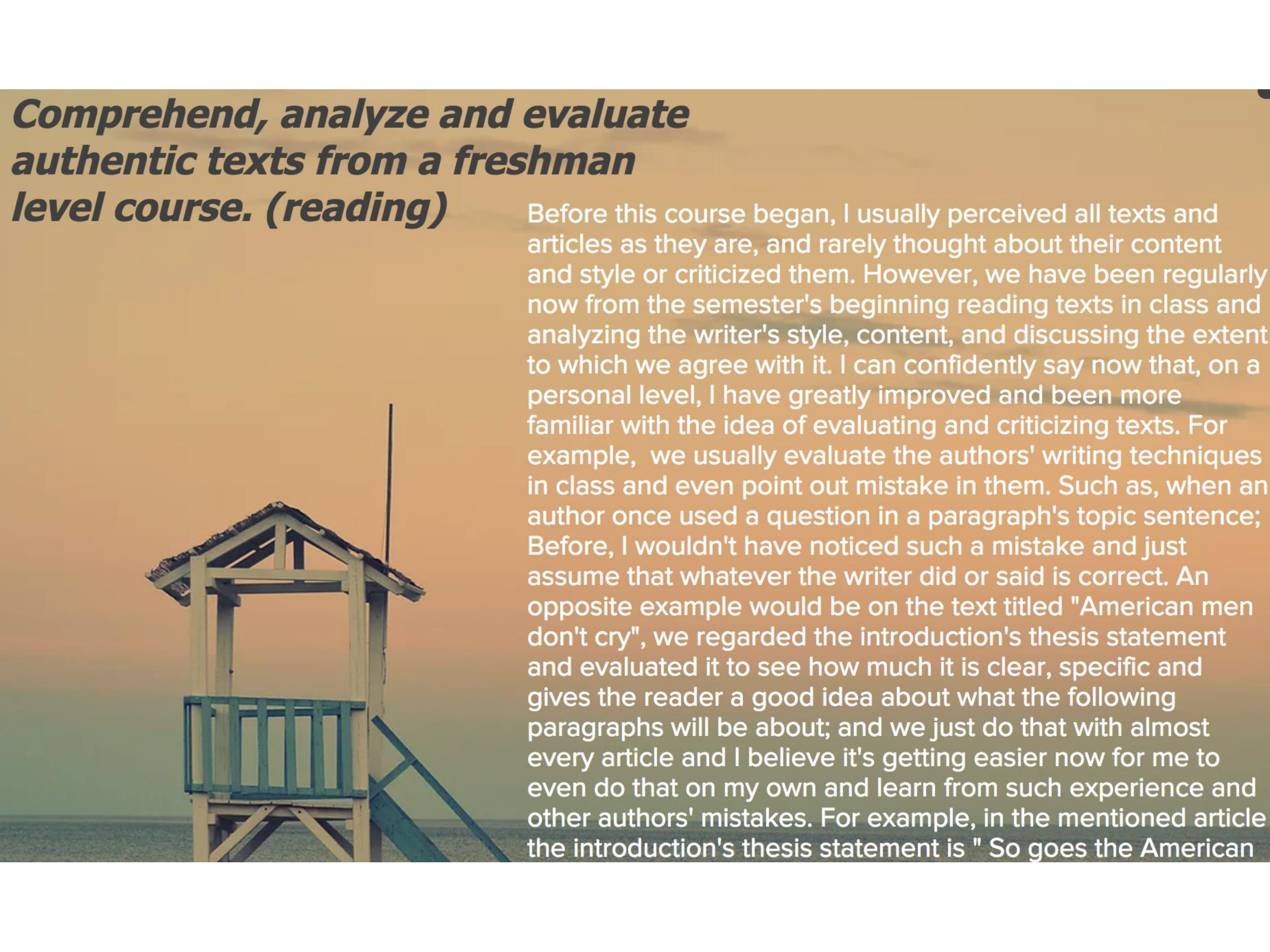

It is shown from the actual essay that I have an issue with the word choice and elaboration of the ideas. But in the rewrite I made my best to solve those mistakes, by clarifying more the ideas and for the word choice i used a dictionary that made my life easier. As seen in the rewrite the errors are minimized because I learned from my previous mistakes in the actual essay.

Comprehend, analyze and evaluate authentic texts from a freshman level course. (reading)

Before this course began, I usually perceived all texts and articles as they are, and rarely thought about their content and style or criticized them. However, we have been regularly now from the semester's beginning reading texts in class and analyzing the writer's style, content, and discussing the extent to which we agree with it. I can confidently say now that, on a personal level, I have greatly improved and been more familiar with the idea of evaluating and criticizing texts. For example, we usually evaluate the authors' writing techniques in class and even point out mistakes in them. Such as, when an author once used a question in a paragraph's topic sentence; Before, I wouldn't have noticed such a mistake and just assume that whatever the writer did or said is correct. An opposite example would be on the text titled "American men don't cry", we regarded the introduction's thesis statement and evaluated it to see how much it is clear, specific and gives the reader a good idea about what the following paragraphs will be about; and we just do that with almost every article and I believe it's getting easier now for me to even do that on my own and learn from such experience and other authors' mistakes. 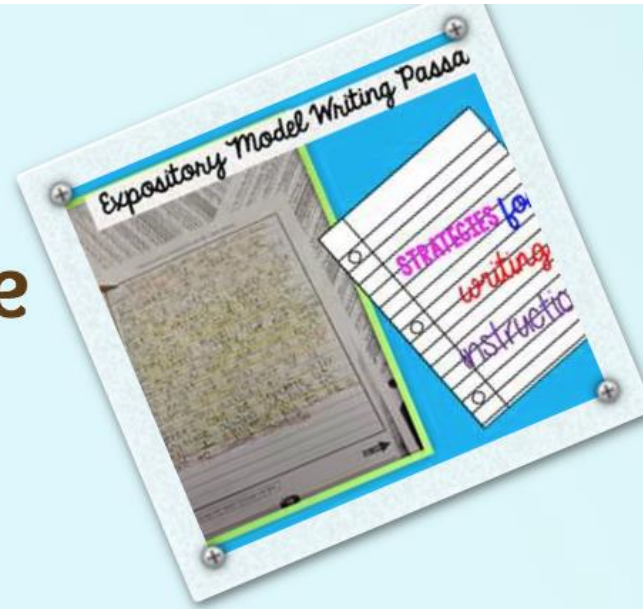
