PBHL 306 A: Library and Literature Search Skills (0 Credits)


A 2 day hands-on compulsory workshop for all Master Public Health students


The program started in fall 2014 -2015 with a series of four core workshops - 2 workshops per semester

Currently the workshop series consists of six workshops and was established to introduce continuing graduate students to key concepts in research and academic writing, and to inform them about academic support available at AUB.






