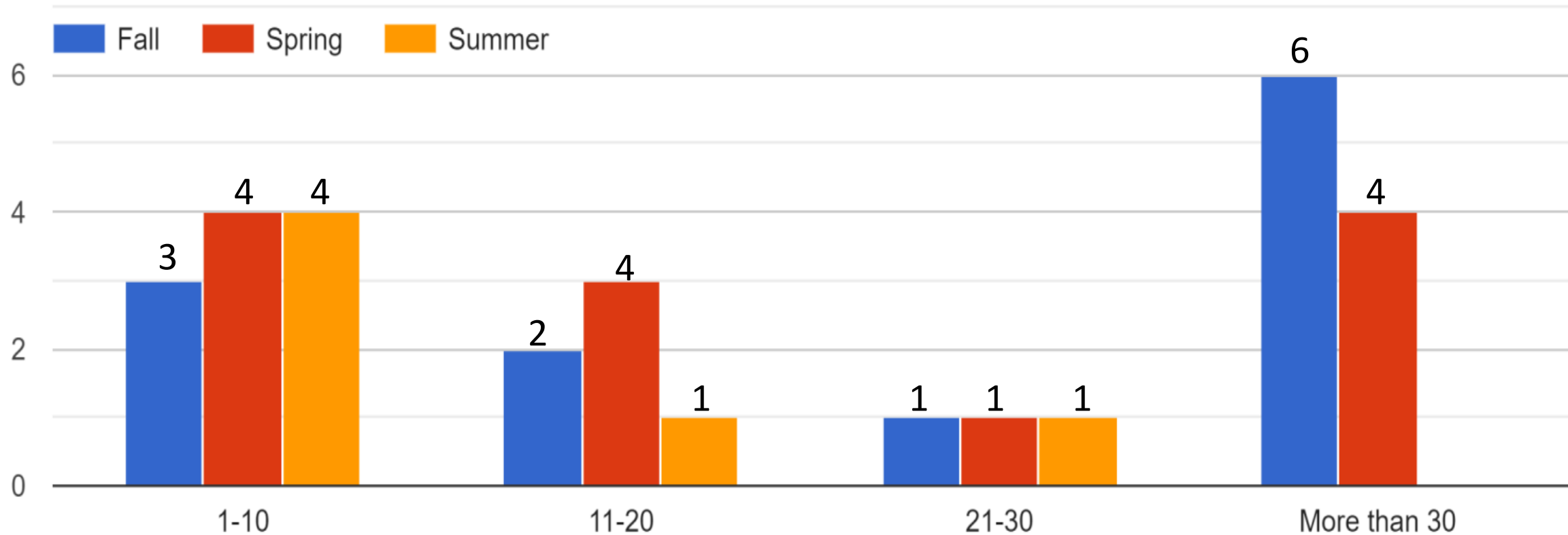

## Information Literacy Sessions per semester/term

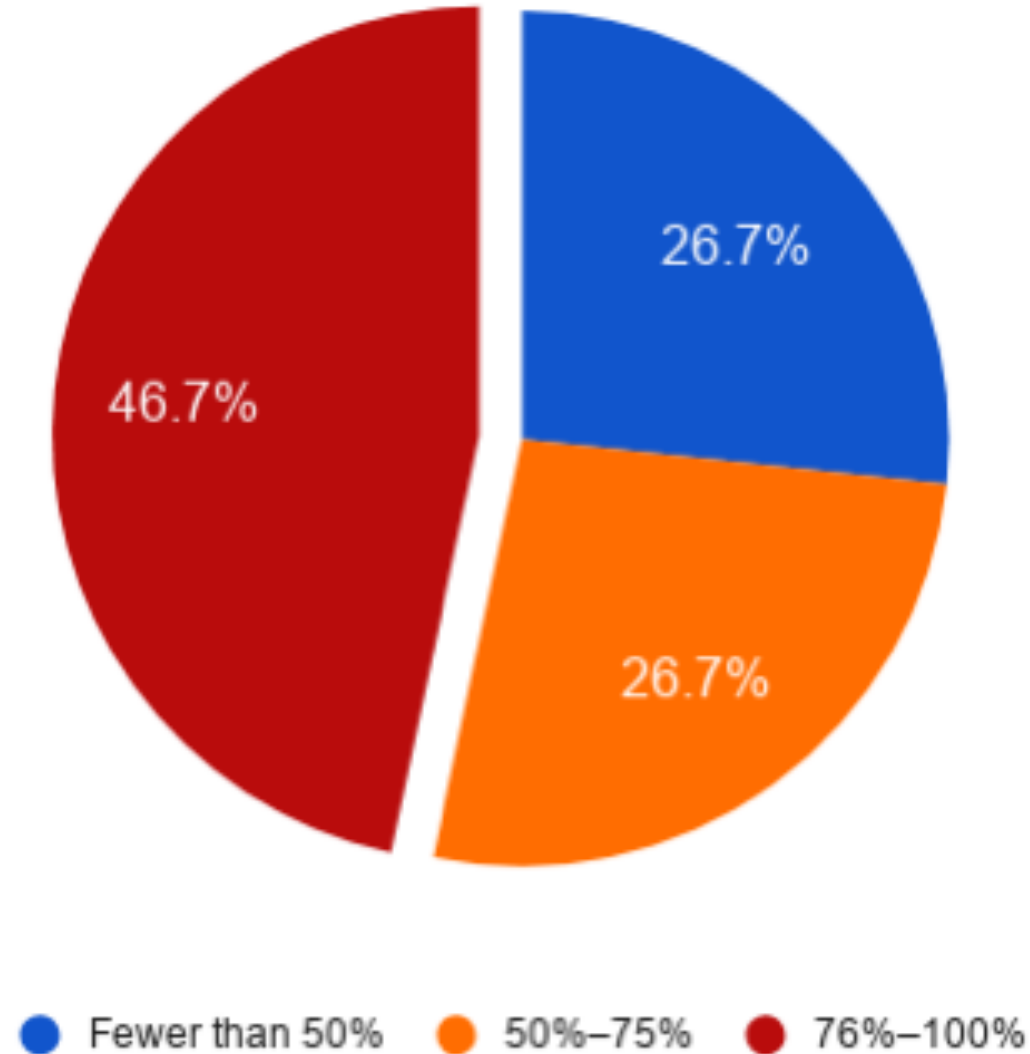

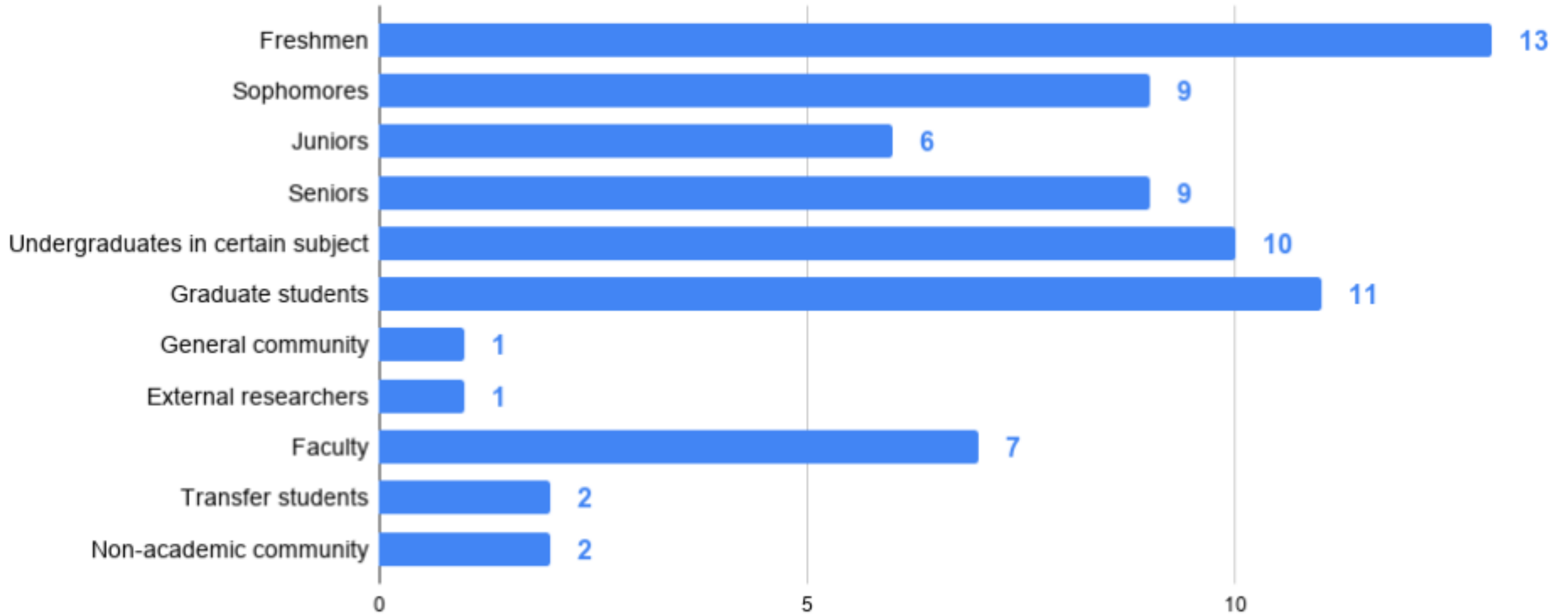
- IL is taught by faculty only

# IL problems



“Lack of identification and acceptance of IL program and the Librarians who are to teach. Only faculty are identified as people who can teach. Meanwhile there is no faculty with Library or IL training/qualification.”

“Lack of acknowledgment by the institution of the librarians' role as teachers; almost non-existent chance for the librarians to have a say into academic matters”

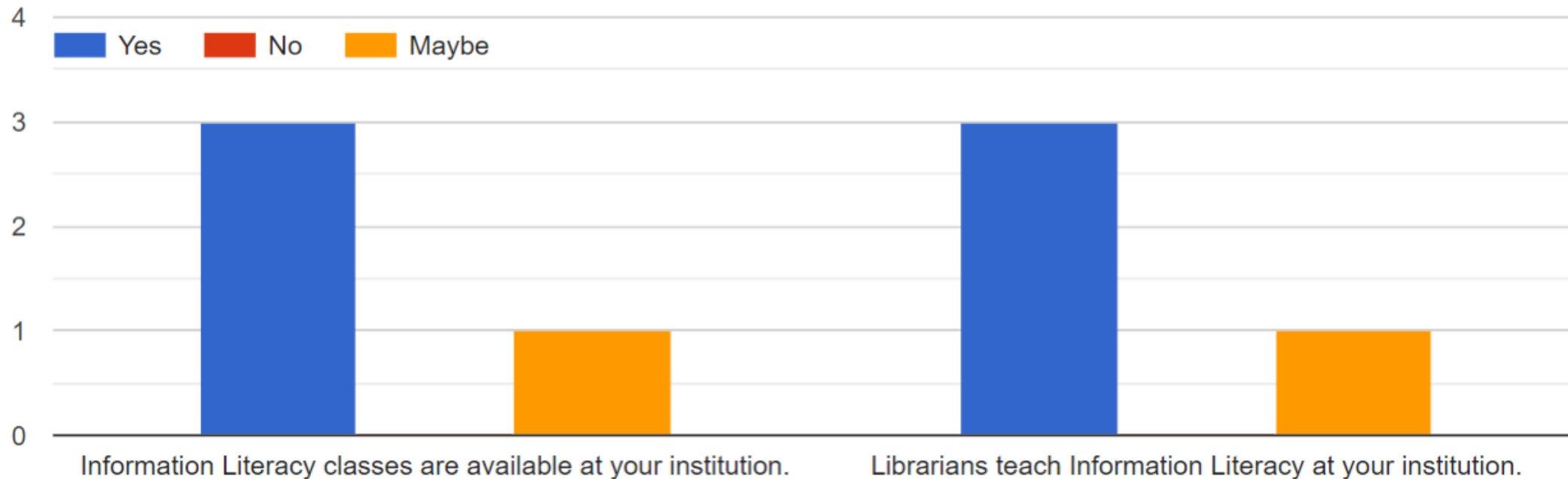

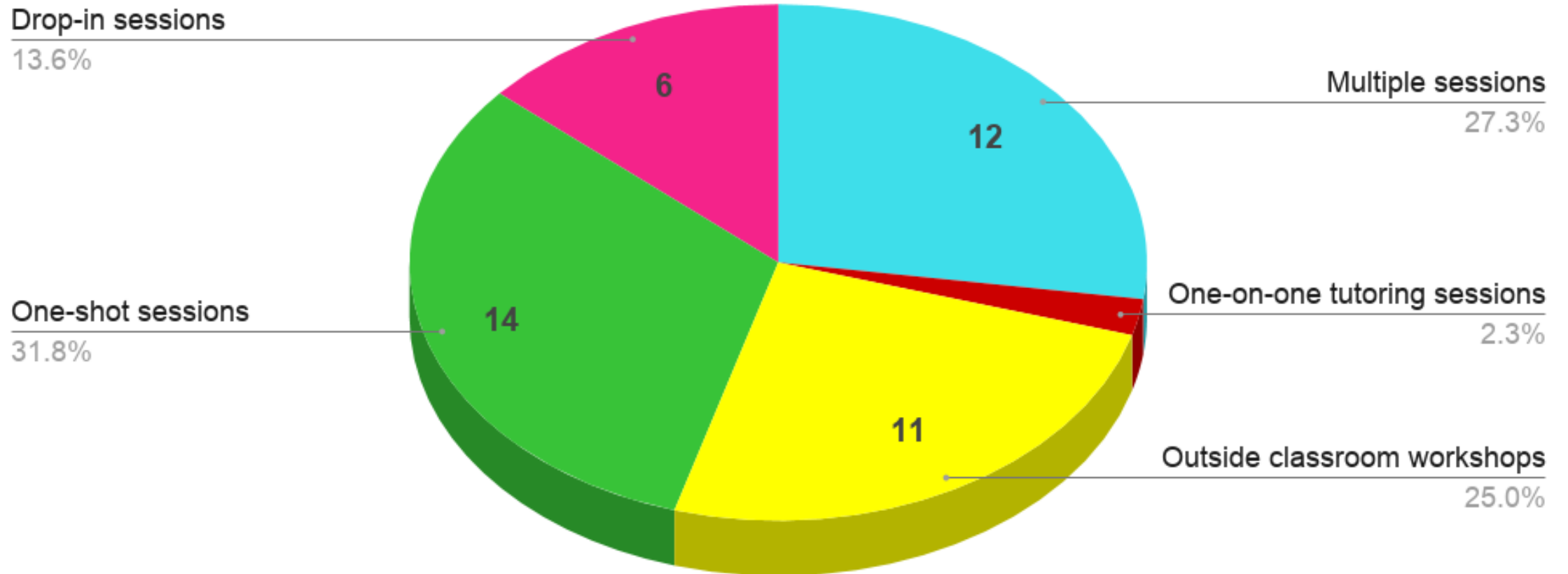

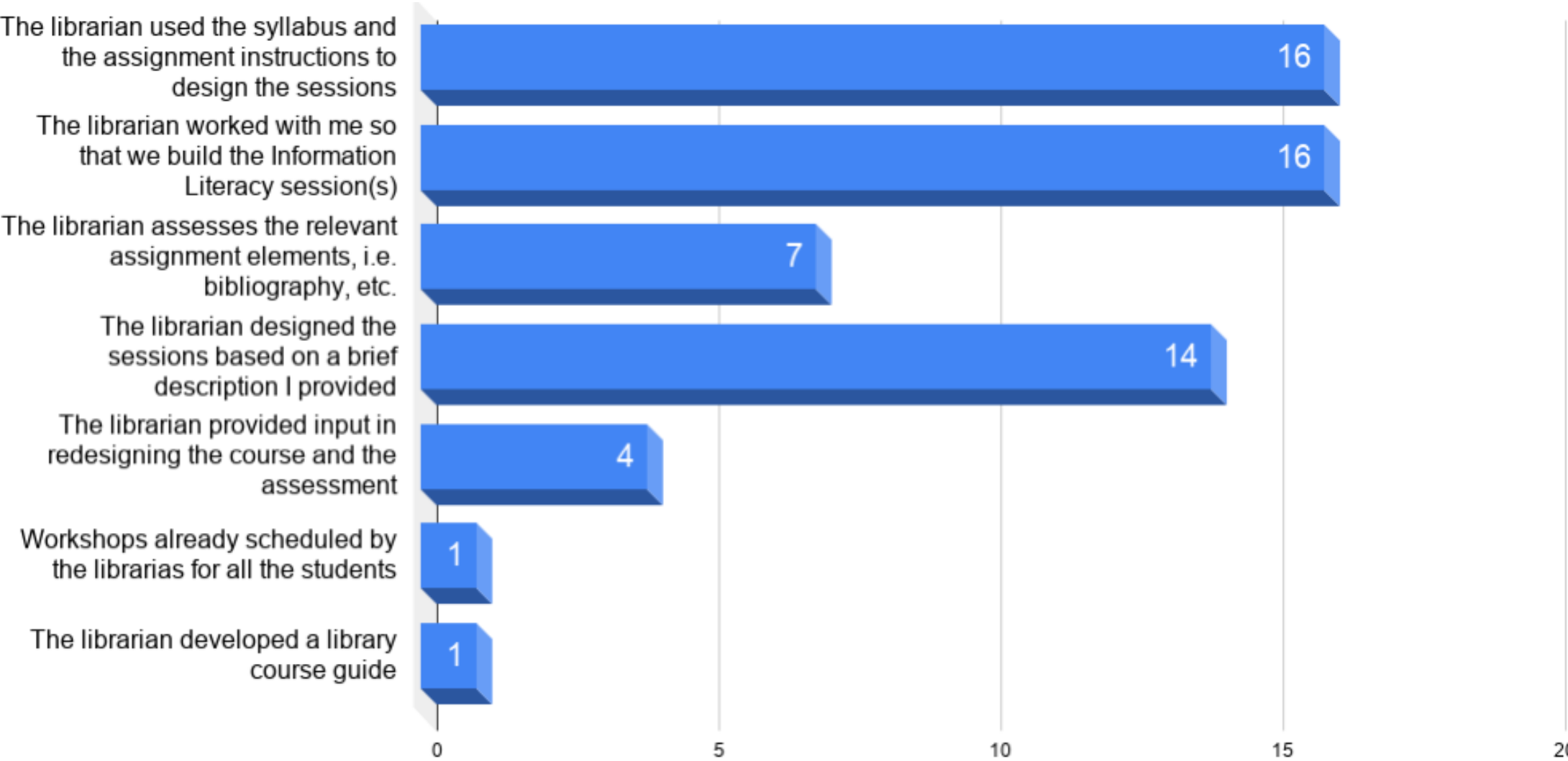

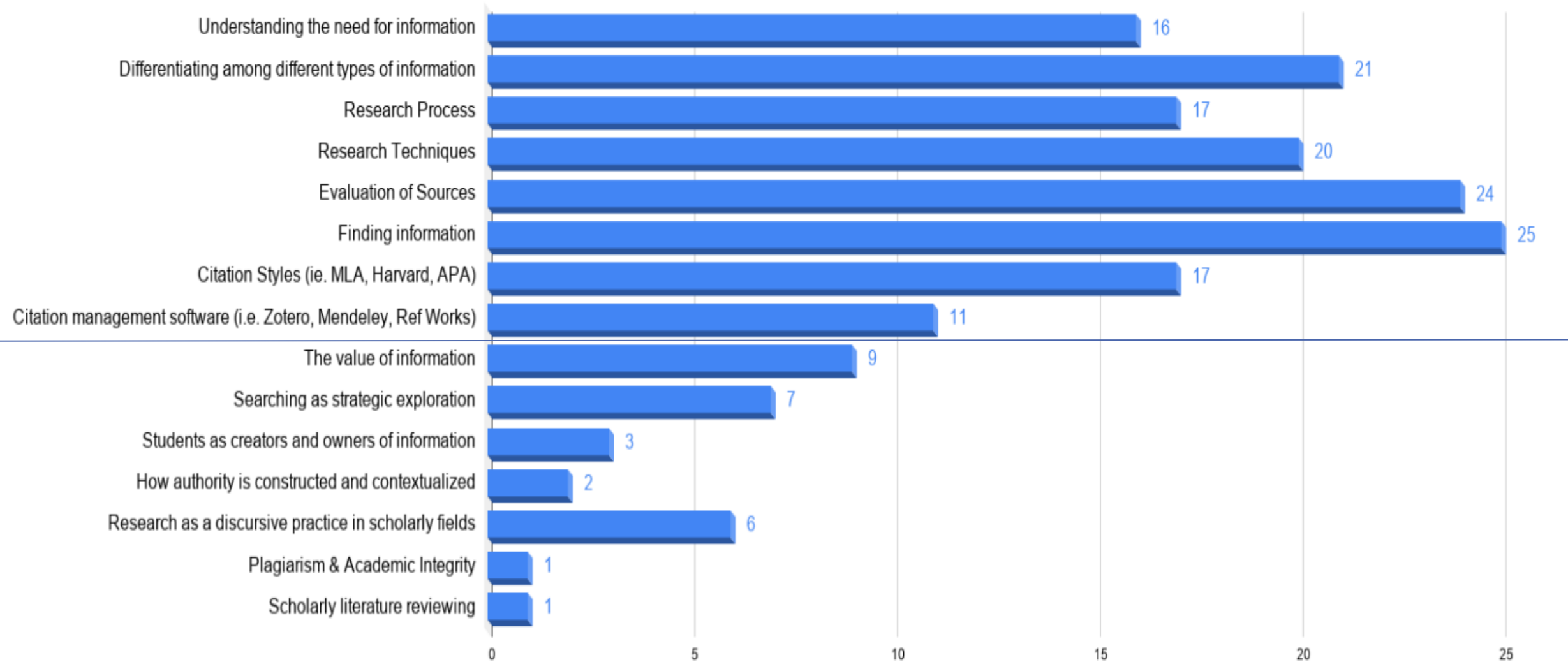


# Nature of this collaboration

# Faculty-Librarian collaboration improvement

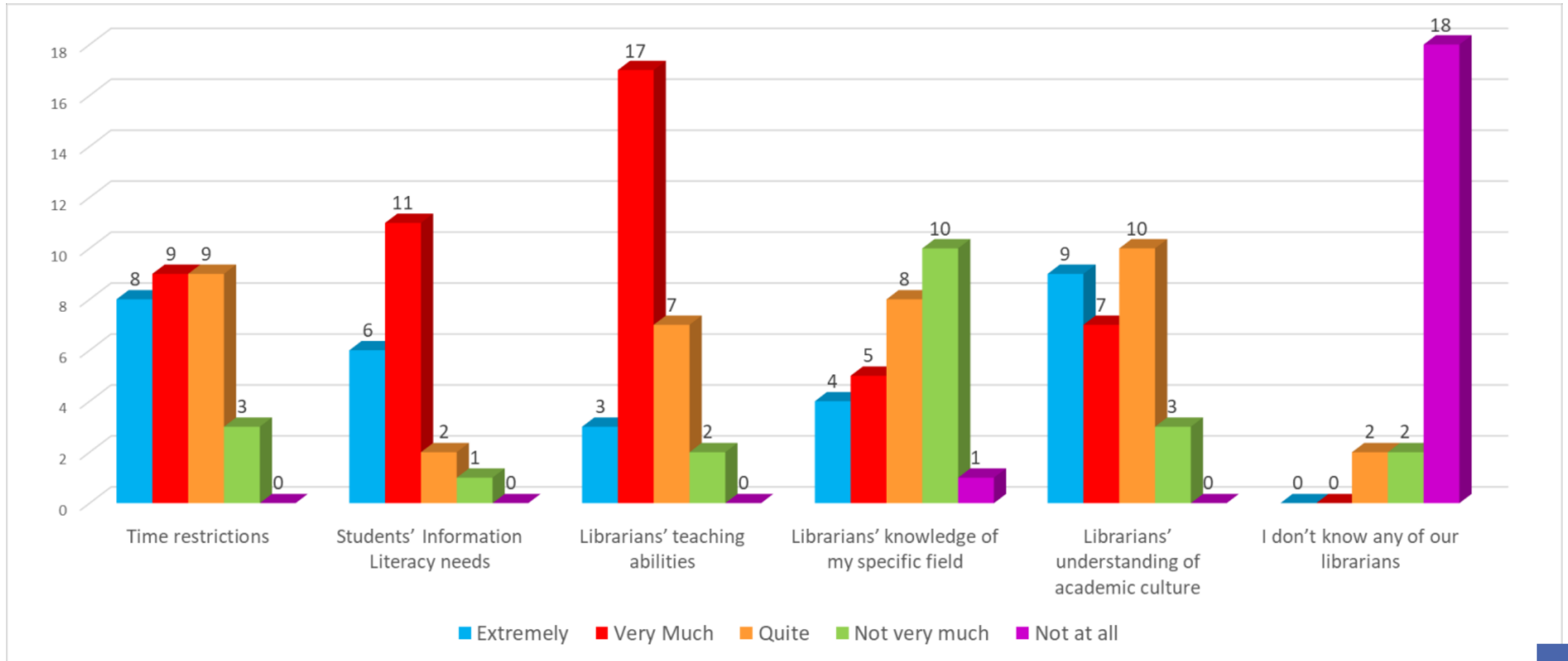

- More time for follow up





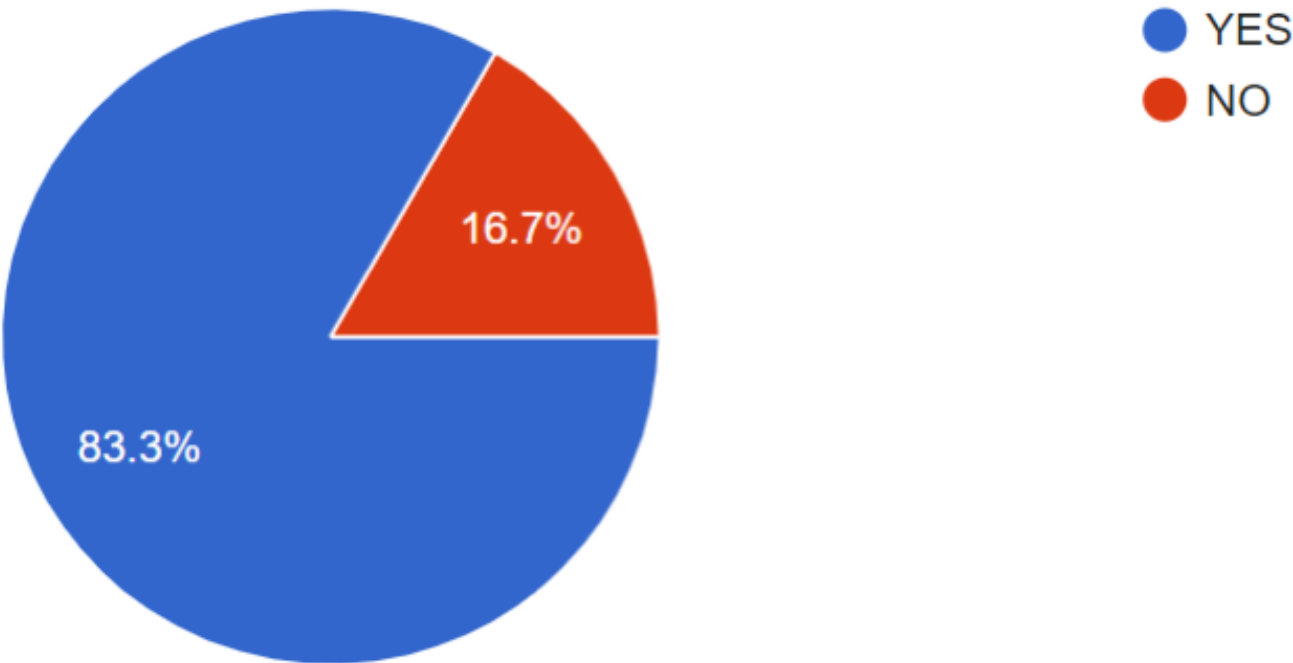

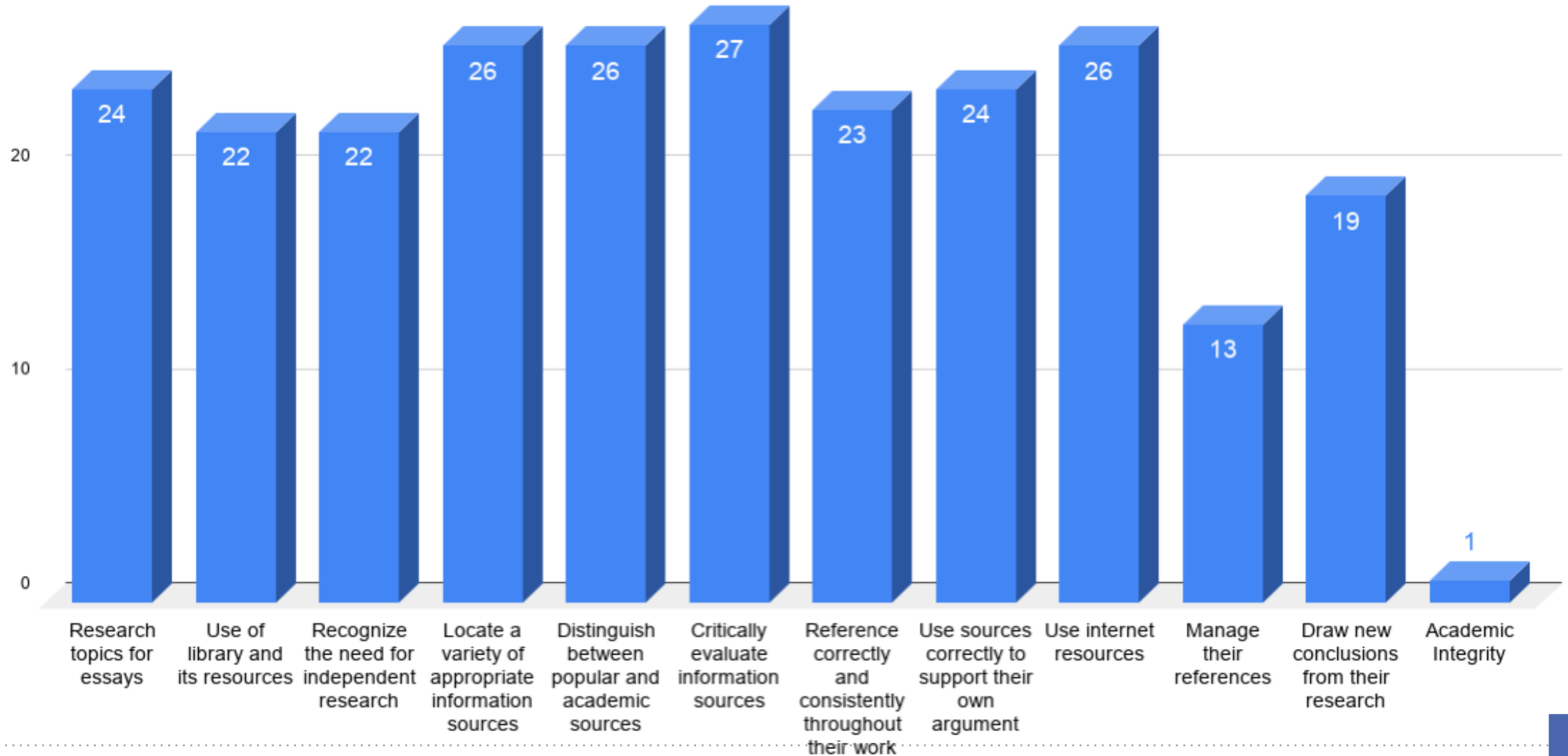

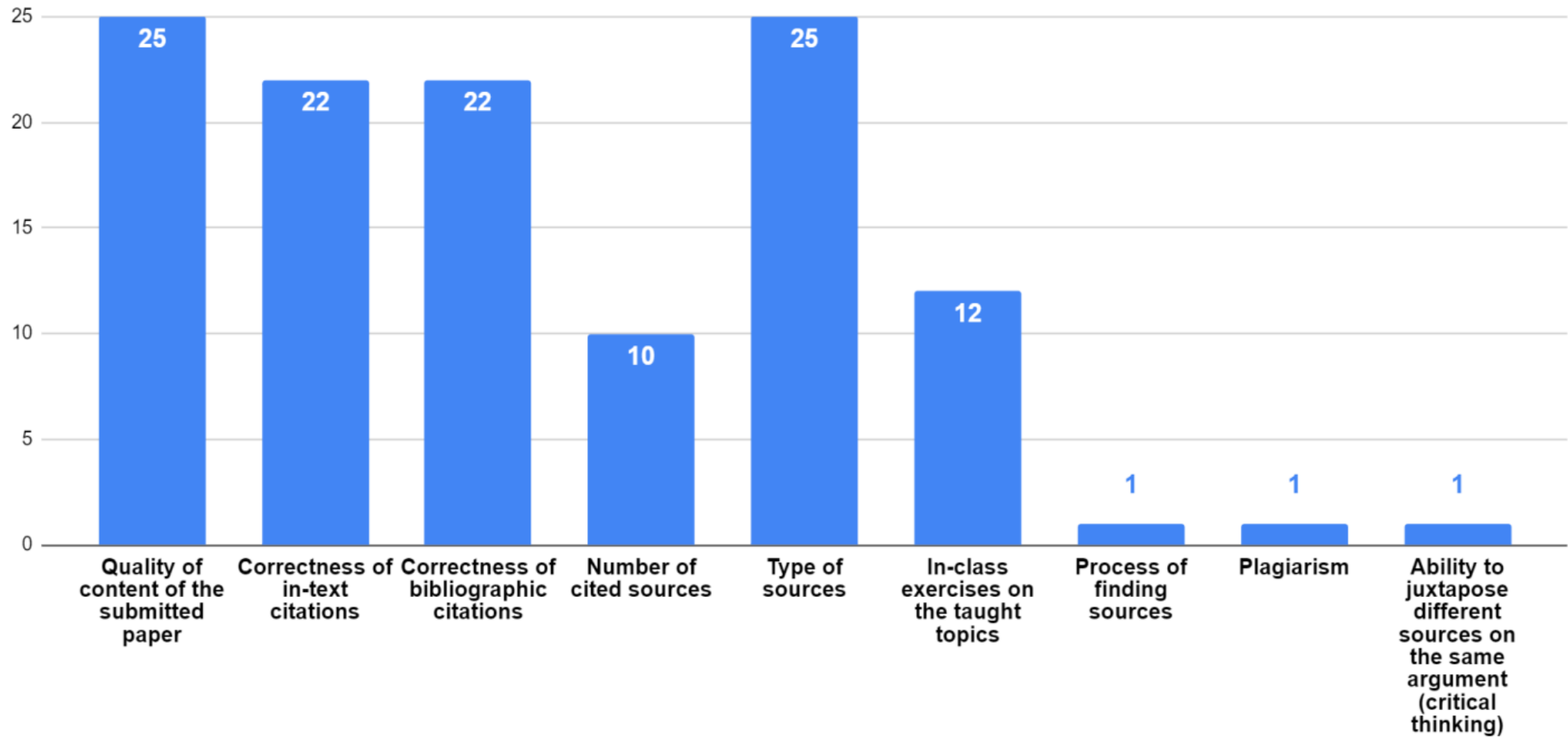
