Focus - Assessment

A Changing Pedagogical Model: Collaborative, Experiential and Multimodal

Collaborative spaces for group work outside the classroom leveraging a team-based learning (TBL) model.

Flexible spaces provide room for **Problem-Based** and **Experiential Learning** Opportunities.

Technology and spaces to support **UDL Principles**.



TBL Outside the Classroom: Library Structured Space

Multiple **Group Study Rooms** line the perimeter of the Learning Commons in the W.E.B. Du Bois Library.

Technology and **Table Space** are equally important.

Space infrastructure should be outfitted to support **Multiple Devices** for *each student*.



TBL Outside the Classroom: Library UN-Structured Space

Where there is **Electricity** and **Table Space**, groups will naturally form.

For each **collaborative space**, ensure that **learners also have quiet spaces** available for individual study.

Public, protected, academic spaces invite working **alone together** or in groups.



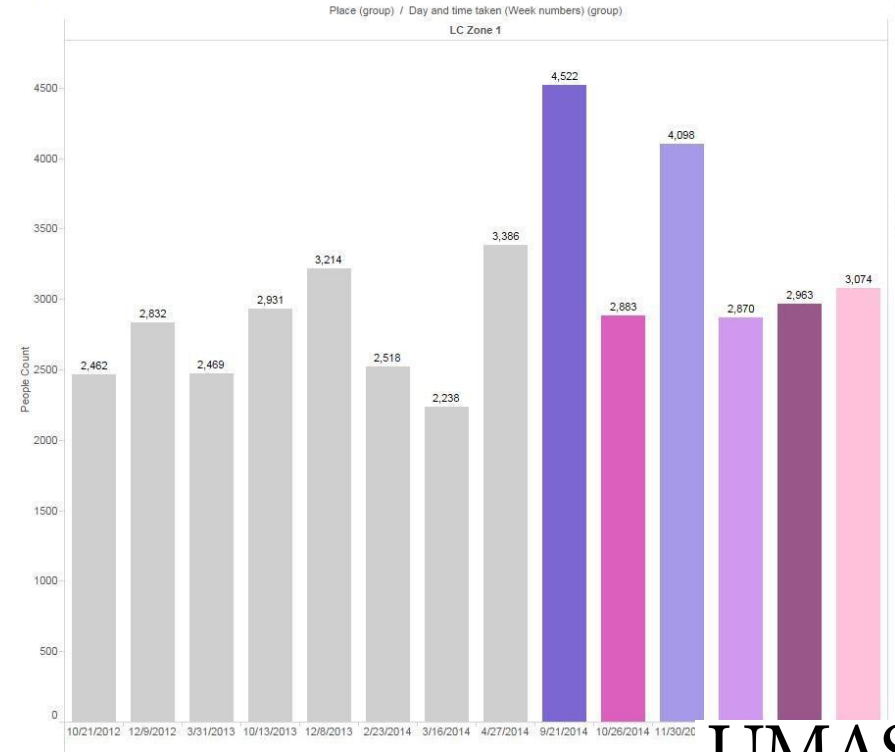

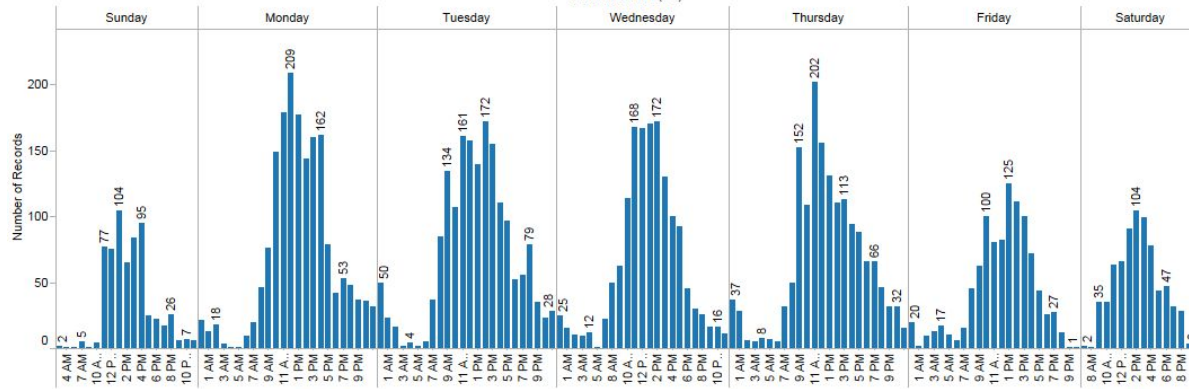

LC Zone 1 Before and After Installation of Microclimates

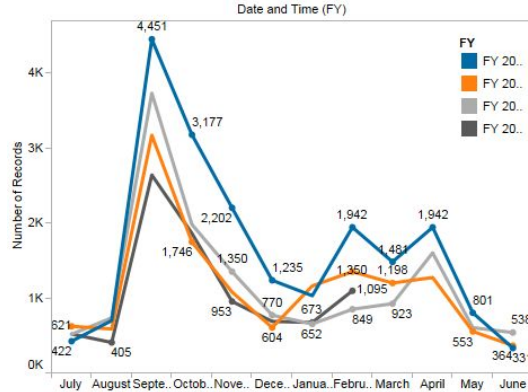


Desk Transactions DOW and Month

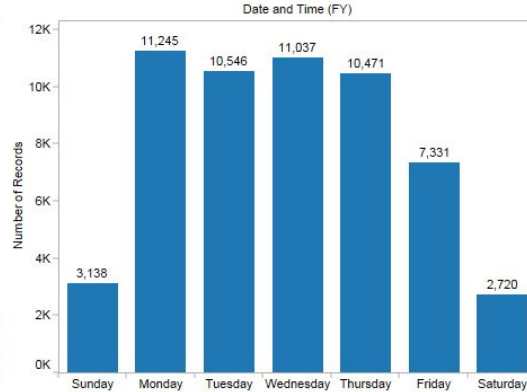
Hour by Day FY16 to Date



FY Monthly Total

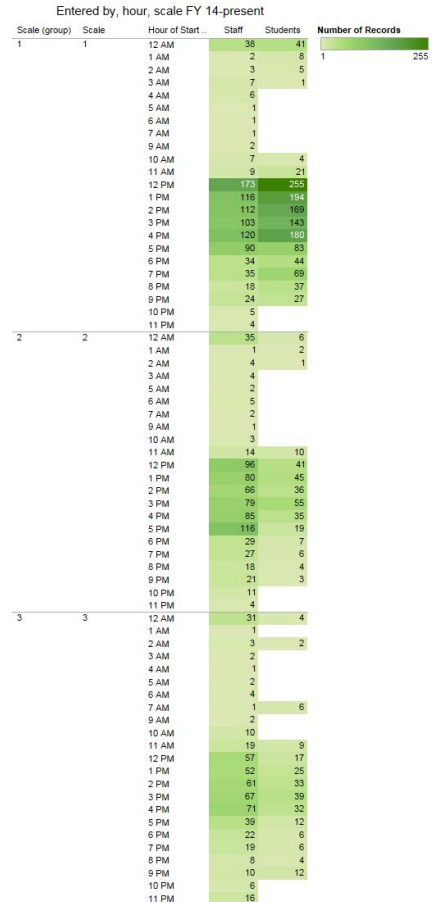


Day of Week by Desk FY16 to Date

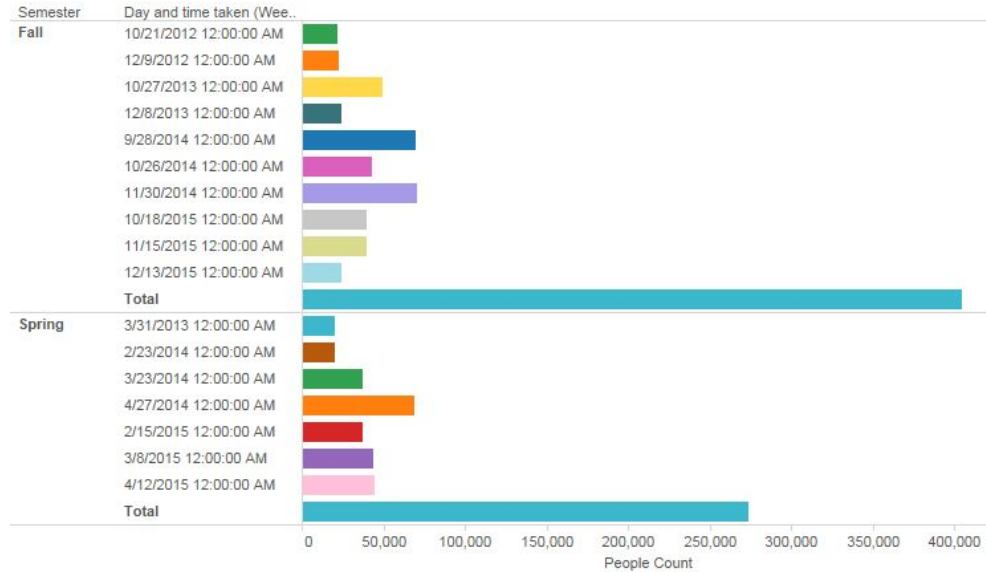

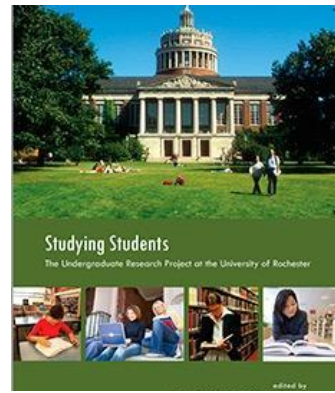


Fall vs. Spring Building Totals by Headcount Week

Connecting with Anthropology to Tell the User's Story

Participant Observation

- Observe student behaviors in learning commons
- Observe student interactions with peers in learning commons

Ethnographic Interviews

- Are students using the learning commons for academic purposes?
- Learn *why* students choose the learning commons as a location for academic study

Focus Group Interviews

- Using Photovoice (Gubrium & Harper, 2013) technique, gather images of spaces that inspire or discourage academic work
- Review images and discuss positive/negative attributes

Archival Analysis of Primary Documents

- Digital scanning of primary documents on the Learning Commons historical establishment/development
- Digital scanning/transcription of field notes

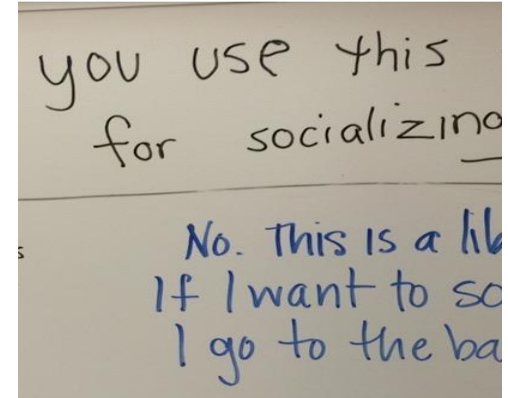
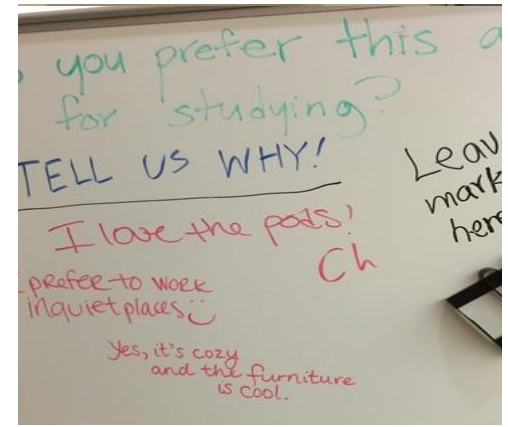
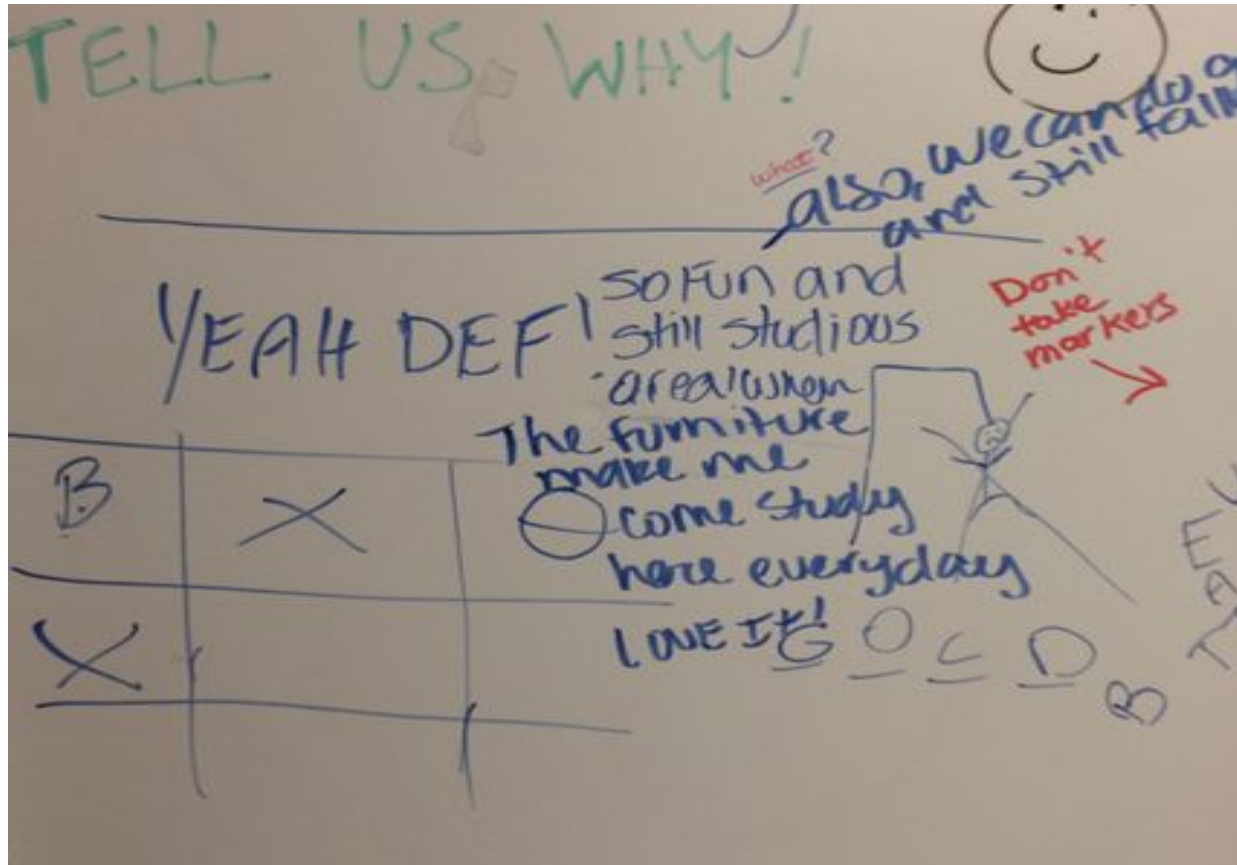
Connection to be made to the four main categories of student learning outcomes outlined in the Collegiate Learning Assessment (CLA):

- writing

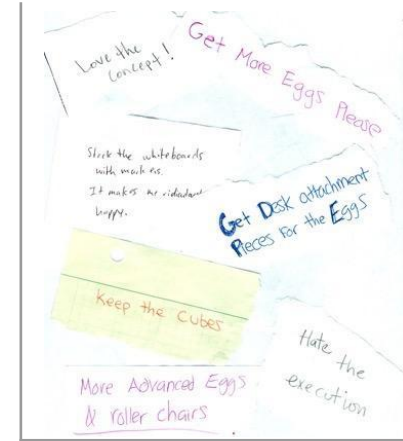

Ethnographic research needs to be first in the mixed methods sequence, as it will inform all subsequent quantitative methods in the case study.

This ethnographic study will identify emerging themes in space, services and equipment use by students, as well as overall satisfaction with the learning commons. Emergent themes can then be applied to creation of quantitative measurements to scale up and round out the case study.

We have determined that students enjoy academic ambience, while still having their (perceived) privacy.

Study Findings

There needs to be a better communication of services/what is available to our patrons. They aren't sure who's supposed to help with what, or where they should be going to get it.

Wayfinding/Communication

Study Findings

Students do not currently feel comfortable with asking others to move from the group study rooms (even with current signage).

Room Reservation/Communication

Study Findings

Students view many spaces on campus, including some parts of the Learning Commons, to be ‘White Spaces.’ However, more students of color have been observed in the Microclimates.

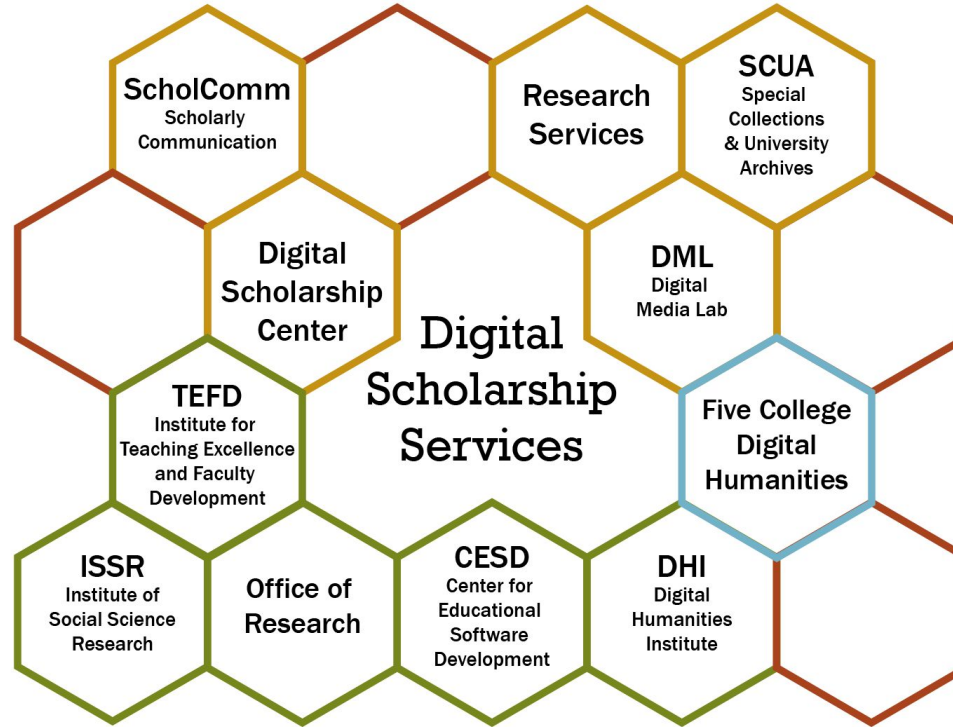

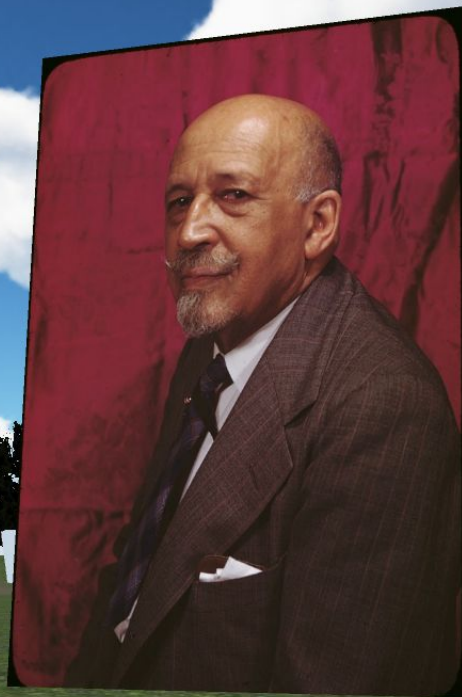

Though updated national statistics for college and university student suicides are not available, confirmed data from several colleges and universities suggests that the rate of death by suicide might have skyrocketed since the implementation of pandemic-related restrictions on college campuses. Here are just a few of the colleges and universities that have confirmed alarming numbers of deaths by suicide:

- ▶ [Dartmouth College](#), two in one year

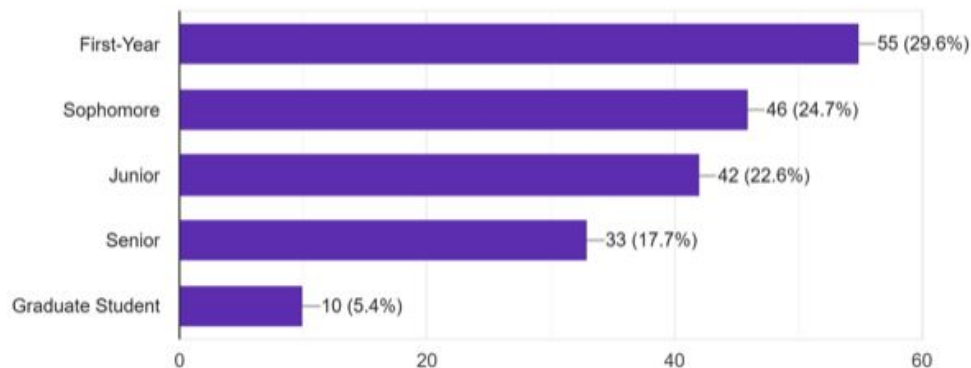

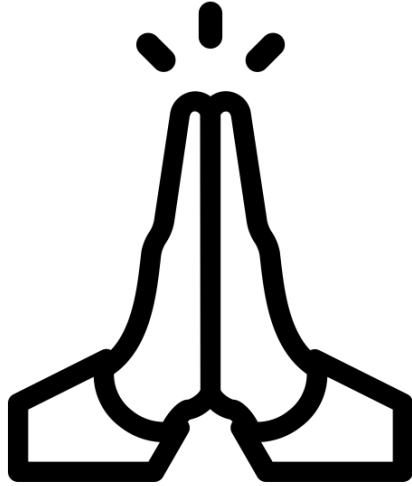
